In what year should a Minister take their sabbatical?

* Start year as Probationary Minister in the Methodist Church in Britain as (See Standing Order 800) or year of entry as a Recognised and Regarded Minister. Ministers from the Irish Conference are entitled to a sabbatical in the 7th year after their last sabbatical (or the 7th year of travel on their home connexion).

When Sabbaticals were first introduced into the Methodist Church they were offered in the 10th year and then every 7th years: (17th 24th 31st years etc). The 2018 Conference changed the sabbatical pattern so that the first sabbatical should be taken in the 7th year of travel followed by the 14th, 21st, 28th 35th years etc. (See Standing Order 744)
